

Write a Haiku

Attempt the Japanese tradition of haiku poems. A haiku poem consists of 3 lines; the first and last lines have 5 syllables, the middle line has 7 syllables. They range in subject and mood. As WikiHow.com gives the following tip:

- The haiku doesn't have to be serious. It can be funny, although traditionalists might call it a 'senryu' rather than a 'haiku.' Please note that the following is not an example of senryu, but merely a three-line poem that attempts to be funny (this is the sort of poem that both haiku and senryu writers consider to be what has been called a 'pseudo-haiku' or 'pseudo-senryu'):

*I like Cottage Cheese
Cottage Cheese is my favorite
Yummy Cottage Cheese*

- Or:

*I Like this nice girl
She is in my English class
she doesn't like me*
